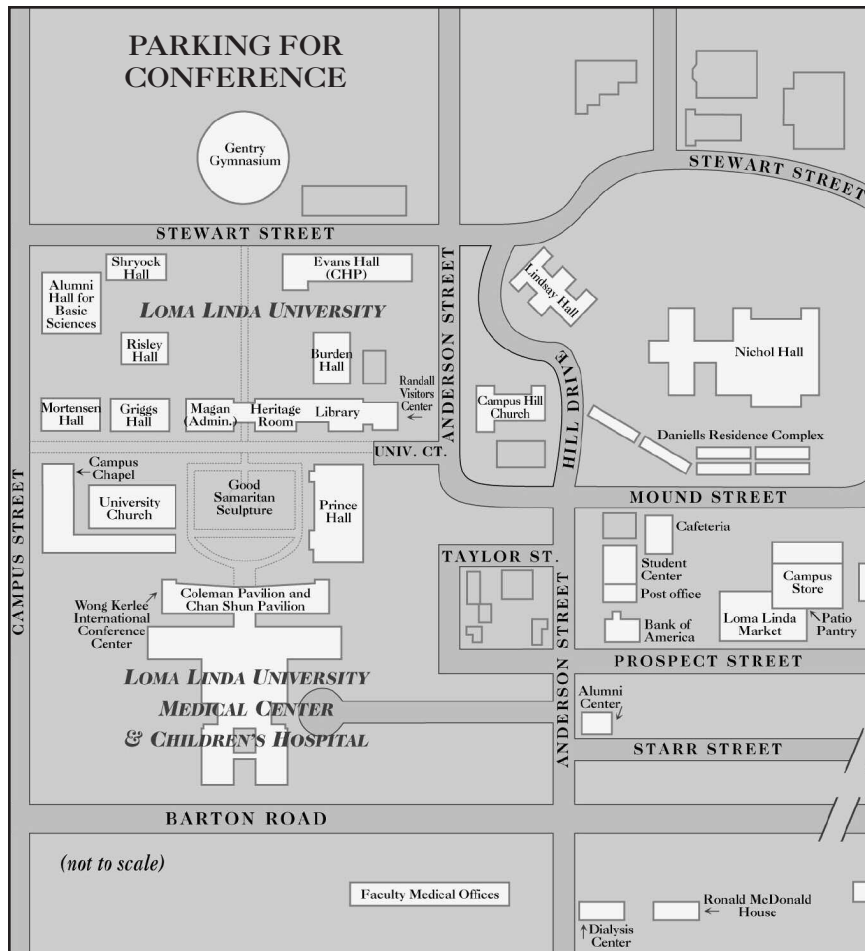

About the Speakers



John Baldwin is professor of theology at the Seventh-day Adventist Theological Seminary where he has held a faculty appointment since 1987. Baldwin is an ordained minister and served for eight years as pastor in the Illinois and Greater New York Conferences. In 1990 he earned a PhD from the University of Chicago.



John Brunt has served the Seventh-day Adventist church as a pastor, teacher, administrator, and author. He earned a PhD at Emory University in the area of New Testament studies. He served as a professor of religion at Walla Walla College and is presently senior pastor of the Azure Hills Seventh-day Adventist Church.



Michael W. Campbell is associate chair of Archives & Special Collections and associate director of the Ellen G. White Estate Branch Office. He is currently writing his PhD dissertation on the 1919 Bible Conference.



Gary Land is chair of the history department at Andrews University. A native of California, Dr. Land attended Pacific Union College and earned a PhD in history from the University of California, Santa Barbara, in 1973. He also actively participates in a variety of professional societies including the Conference on Faith and History.



Timothy G. Standish hold a research appointment at the Geoscience Research Institute. Born in Australia, Dr. Standish attended Andrews University and earned a PhD in environmental biology from George Mason University. Dr. Standish is an educator at heart and travels internationally teaching courses on science and religion.
