
## Acquisitions Report for FY 2012 - 2013

In this 4th quarter report, we will be highlighting only those acquisitions acquired since our last meeting on 26 November 2012. However the list of acquisitions at the end of this publication includes all titles purchased during the fiscal year.

Like previous years, most of our acquisitions this year fall into the categories of Biblical Prophecy — we've been able to locate and acquire several Froom titles; Battle Creek Sanitarium and John Harvey Kellogg; and one additional example of the job printing done by the Pacific Press Publishing Company.


Additional acquisitions that don't fall into the categories mentioned above, include two works by Mrs. S. M. I. Henry; an early promotional piece for the city of Redlands that includes a nice description of Loma Linda; an important early work on Vegetarianism and one on homeopathy. These two works, while not Adventist publications, meet our collection development guidelines in that a vegetarian diet has always been a mainstay of Adventist health recommendations, and we are seeing a return to the more homeopathic and alternative methods of treating illnesses and complaints in our Adventist health institutions and communities. Our collection development policy states we will focus part of our efforts on the areas where the health sciences and Adventism intersect.

## Biblical Prophecy

Jonathan Cummings was a farmer in New Hampshire who became an ardent preacher in 1830 and a firm believer in the Millerite message. Like many other followers of William Miller, Cummings struggled to find an explanation for the Great Disappointment of 1844. After much study, Cummings came to the conclusion that the calculation of the ending of 2300 Day prophecy was only ten years off, ending in 1854, not 1844. Le Roy Froom states that there were some Millerites that went back to the chronologies, convinced that perhaps they had done the math incorrectly, and new times were set for the 2nd Coming. Cummings was obviously of this number. While Froom doesn't mention Cummings by name, or discuss his chart, he did have photographic copies of the chart in his papers that have become the Advent Source Collection at Andrews University. He also had two copies of the *Explanation of the Prophetic Chart*, which Cummings published the following year. The present copy is a beautiful example, discovered in an estate in Southern Maine, and is a terrific addition to our Millerite and immediate Post-Millerite visual representation of the prophecies of Daniel and Revelation. To date, we have only been able to locate three copies - - Aurora University in the Jenks Memorial Collection of Adventual Material; Andrews University (although theirs is uncolored and with several holes in the fabric); and Yale University.





and following pages, affording modern accommodations for 1,200 guests. Bath and treatment apartments and laboratories furnished with the latest scientific appliances and apparatus.









This little booklet makes it abundantly clear that Kellogg wasn't building a health institution, but rather a temple to health and the Battle Creek Method, but also, dare we say, to himself.

#### The Building of a Temple of Health

The destruction of the main buildings of the Battle Creek Sanitarium on the morning of February 18, 1902, afforded an opportunity such as has rarely been offered for the construction and equipment of a building which should stand as a model for the world as a temple of health and healing. The managers of the institution were not slow to recognize this, and although not a little embarrassed, financially and otherwise, by the great loss sustained by the fire, soon set about making plans for the erection of a new structure which would be in every way more suitable for the purposes required of it than the burned buildings had been.

#### The First of its Kind.

The Battle Creek Sanitarium was the first institution of the sort in the world; that is, it was the first medical institution at which an attempt was made to bring together in one place and under one management all rational healing agencies, giving special prominence to those physiological or natural healing agents the scientific knowledge of which has been chiefly developed within the last century, especially hydrotherapy, electrotherapy, massage, exercise, diet, sunlight, mental and moral influences, rest, and general health culture.

#### The Evolution of the Sanitarium Idea.

The completion and equipment of this temple of health marks another advance step in the progress of scientific medicine. The Battle Creek Sanitarium


