Acquisitions Report for FY 2017—2018, 1st and 2nd quarters

Our acquisition efforts during this first half of fiscal year 2017-2018, have focused on Biblical Prophecy. Taking the bibliographies created by comparing our current holdings against L. E. Froom's 4-volume work *The Prophetic Faith of Our Fathers*, and searching the authors and titles we don't have against what booksellers both here and abroad are offering, we have located and acquired nineteen works to date. Of the nineteen, only four are not found in Froom. With the remaining fifteen works, the authors of five of the titles are discussed by Froom, but not these specific titles. Since the preparation of this report, several additional volumes have been located and ordered. If they arrive in time, they will be added. If not, they will be at the top of the list in the next report!

I learned an interesting tidbit about one of the booksellers from whom we have acquired several works—he has actually read Froom! I noticed in his description of the most recent book acquired that he stated "cited by Froom..." First time I had come across such in a bookseller's description. I commented on this to him which is when he told me that he actually enjoyed reading Froom and has sold four sets over the years, always keeping the scruffiest set for the shop. I have also located a bookseller up in Winnipeg that has a focus in Icelandic literature, and had amongst his holdings several Ellen G. White titles in Icelandic, along with a John Gottlieb Matteson title in Icelandic. You never know what you are going to find!

We did acquire one work, so far, that falls outside the Biblical Prophecy category, that being a work by William Andrus Alcott that joins the thirty-three other works by Alcott on diet & health to be found in within the holdings of the Heritage Research Center.

With seven months yet to go in this current fiscal year, we have every expectation that we will continue to find important works that build on the tremendous foundation to be found in the areas of Seventh-day Adventist history, diet, and Biblical prophecy.







Time. As to ascertain the meaning of the different terms of time, in the fymbolic language, is of very great importance, the more attention is due to it Mr. Daubuz and Dr. Lancaster have brought forward a great deal of very important matter on this subject, which throws much light on it; and which should be well confidered by those who would understand those prophecies in which terms of time are mentioned, and numbers given.* "Days, months and years, fays Artemidorus, have not always "their proper fignification, for months are fometimes denoted by "years, and days too, and years and days by months, and months "and years by days. But that this may not become doubtful; " when years are mentioned, if they be proportionable and fuitable, "they may be accounted as years; if over many, as days; the fame rule reciprocally for days; if less as months, let them be "taken according to the prefent occasion." From these words it appears that in the fymbolical language, the aforefaid terms of time are fymbolical; and that the faid terms, are, in the fame language, fynonymous, as they are also in the oriental languages.





Ethan Smith (1762-1849) was born in Massachusetts, and in 1780 joined the American Army. Returning home, he was converted and joined the church in 1781, establishing prayer meetings in his home. Encouraged to study for the ministry. he went to college. After graduation from Dartmouth in 1790, and a special period of theological study, he served as Congregational-Presbyterian pastor at Hopkinton, New Hampshire, Hebron, New York, Poultney, Vermont, and Hanover, Massachusetts. His last responsibility was as city missionary in Boston.

Froom states that Smith wrote three books on prophecy—A Dissertation on the Prophecies (1811), Key to the Prophecies (1814), and Key to the Revelation (1833), but he fails to mention that there were two different editions of Key to the Revelation—in Thirty-Six Lectures (1833) and—in Thirty-Eight Lectures (1837). Froom also fails to mention A Key to the Figurative Language Found in the Sacred Scriptures (1814), View of the Hebrews (1823), and finally Prophetic Catechism: to Lead to the Study of the Prophetic Scriptures (1839).



This work by William Andrus Alcott, president and founder of the American Vegetarian Society, is both a cookbook and a treatise on the vegetarian diet.

In addition to the discussion of the woman's role as housekeeper, The Young House-Keeper provides recipes for simple vegetarian meals from chapters such as "The Apple", "The Pear", and "The Cucumber." The work was very popular, going through at least twenty editions by 1851.

This particular copy of the Young House-Keeper once belonged to Charles R. MacIvor—his signature and blindstamp shown above. MacIvor who worked at the Battle Creek Food Company with John Harvey Kellogg from 1929 to 1939, and was considered a personal friend. MacIvor's unfinished biography of Kellogg — The Lord's Physician — resides within the Charles Macivor [sic] Collection, the Center for Adventist Research, Andrews University.

CHAPTER XIII.

THE POTATOE.

Importance of the potatoe as an article of diet. Modes of cooking it—boiling, baking, steaming and roasting. Bad boiling. Examples of a better mode. Cooking a potatoe well, seldom understood.
