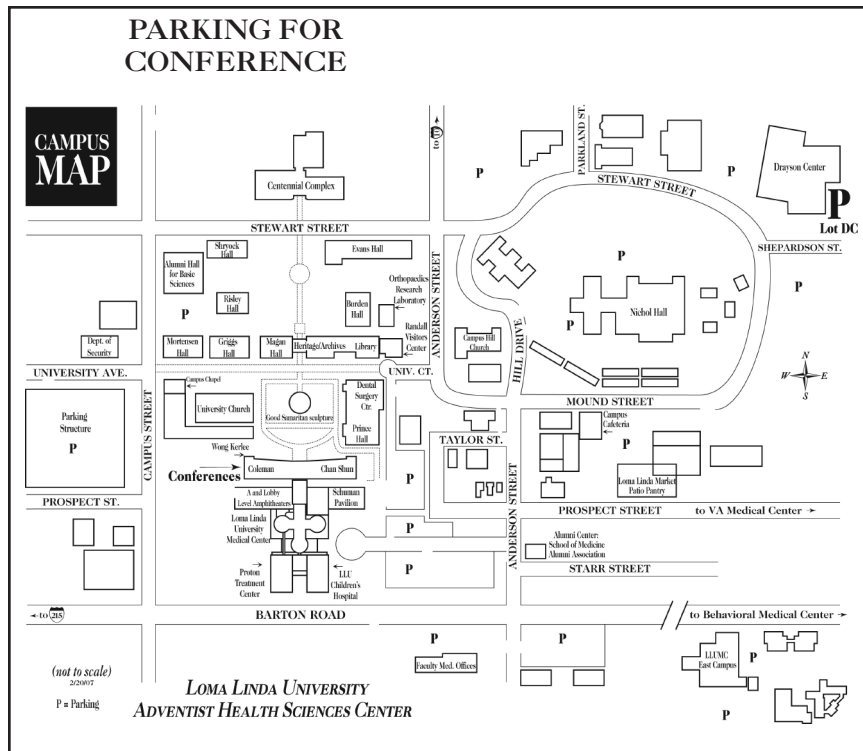

About the Speakers



Thomas J. Mostert Jr. began his ministerial service for the Adventist church in the Arkansas-Louisiana Conference in 1964 upon completion of his masters' degree in religion at Andrews University. He served in a variety of pastoral and administrative posts in the Chesapeake, Potomac, Mountain View, Hawaiian Mission, and Southeastern California conferences. Elder Mostert has been president of the Pacific Union Conference since 1986. Some of his responsibilities include chairing the Adventist Health Board of Directors as well as the boards of La Sierra University and Pacific Union College.



Julius Nam joined the religion faculty at Loma Linda University last summer. He previously taught for three years at Pacific Union College. In 2005 he finished his Ph.D. in Adventist Studies at Andrews University. The topic of his dissertation was an analysis of the reactions to *Questions on Doctrine*. Dr. Nam is no stranger to Southern California having served as a young adult pastor for three years in the Los Angeles area. Prior to that he worked as a pastoral intern in Korea and a pastor for high school and collegiate students in Michigan.



Jon K. Paulien was recently appointed the new dean of the School of Religion at Loma Linda University. He also is continuing his responsibilities this semester as chair of the New Testament department at the Seventh-day Adventist Theological Seminary where he has taught since 1984. Born in New York City, Paulien studied at Atlantic Union College and received his Ph.D. from Andrews University in 1987. Prior to this, he served as a pastor in New York City. He is the author of ten books and over 100 popular and peer-reviewed articles and papers.



Cindy Tutsch is an associate director of the Ellen G. White Estate. Her responsibilities include promoting an enthusiasm and understanding of Ellen White among young people. Her background includes youth ministry and evangelism for 35 years as a youth pastor, Bible teacher, and conference youth director. She initiated Youth Challenge in North America, an evangelistic outreach for teens to teach Bible studies and distribute literature door to door.
